They are a collection of independent but interconnected goals, with hundreds of targets and measurement indicators geared toward 2030.

**These goals were created with businesses in mind, providing a path for them to harness their power by directing their efforts toward specific global objectives.**




# Main means of implementation

# Target #4

Assist developing countries in attaining long-term debt sustainability through coordinated policies aimed at fostering debt financing, debt relief and debt restructuring.

Adopt and implement investment promotion regimes for least developed countries.

Enhance North-South,  
South-South and triangular  
regional and international  
cooperation on and access to  
science, technology  
and innovation.



# Target #7

Promote the development, transfer, dissemination and diffusion of environmentally sound technologies to developing countries on favourable terms.



# Target #8

Fully operationalize the technology bank and science, technology and innovation capacity-building mechanism for least developed countries by 2017 and enhance the use of ICT.



# Target #9

Enhance int'l support for implementing effective capacity-building in developing countries to support national plans to implement all the SDGs.

# Target #11

Significantly increase the exports of developing countries, with a view to doubling the least developed countries' share of global exports by 2020.



# Target #12

Realize timely implementation of duty-free and quota-free market access on a lasting basis for all least developed countries.

# Target #15

Respect each country's policy space and leadership to establish and implement policies for poverty eradication and sustainable development.
